A New Phase at the House

Thanks to you, our community, we've had a phenomenal year...and we're looking forward to an exciting year ahead.

In 2019, we created a five-year plan for the years 2020-2025, with the intention of growing the House, widening our circle of participation, and making our space and programming more accessible, affordable, and approachable to more people than ever before.

Halfway through this five-year period, we're already seeing results (in spite of the pandemic!). This year, we offered a robust schedule of retreats. Our Awakening Hearts fundraising campaign was a huge success. We launched a brand new website and a new, user-friendly system for space rentals.

Our community is growing, and our organization is too! In late 2021, we hired a part-time Community Engagement Specialist, and in 2022 we hired a part-time Hospitality Manager. With our increased capacity, we're excited to expand programming and outreach.


Deepening Practice

This year, we reaffirmed our commitment to creating and sharing meaningful, accessible resources for people at all points on the contemplative journey.


In 2022 we built a new website, re-launched our monthly newsletters, and introduced two new weekly series of contemplative teachings.

- Awakening to Wholeness is a series of prompts, reflections, and teachings about how holding the tension of opposites can help us to heal division.









Sustaining Connection

We're grateful to the community that has helped us to weather the pandemic years of flux and instability. Here's a snapshot of the financial health of EHoP in 2022.

During 2022, the House of Prayer worked to rebuild—and also expand—our capacity. Retreats began filling up again, rental groups returned to the House (the space was rented for 106 nights this year!), and 121 people supported us with donations to our general fund, annual appeal, or Bishop Anderson Scholarship fund.
